	<p>Charge No. 1 of 9 On 12 November 2025 Failed to comply with a requirement of Standard 3.2.2 Clause 6(1)(a) of the Food Standards Code in that when storing food the food business failed to store the food in such a way that it was protected from the likelihood of contamination, contrary to Section 22(1) of the Food Act 2008.</p> <p>Charge No. 2 of 9 On 12 November 2025 Failed to comply with a requirement of Standard 3.2.2 Clause 6(2)(a) of the Food Standards Code in that the food business when storing potentially hazardous food failed to store it under temperature control, contrary to Section 22(1) of the Food Act 2008.</p> <p>Charge No. 3 of 9 On 12 November 2025 Failed to comply with a requirement of Standard 3.2.2 Clause 17(1)(d)(i) of the Food Standards Code in that the food business failed to provide at or near each hand washing facility single use towels or other means of effectively drying hands that were not likely to transfer pathogenic micro-organisms to the hands, contrary to Section 22(1) of the Food Act 2008.</p>	

	<p>Charge No. 4 of 9 On 17 November 2025 Failed to comply with a requirement of Standard 3.2.2 Clause 6(2)(a) of the Food Standards Code in that the food business when storing potentially hazardous food failed to store it under temperature control, contrary to Section 22(1) of the Food Act 2008.</p> <p>Charge No. 5 of 9 On 17 November 2025 Failed to comply with a requirement of Standard 3.2.2 Clause 24(1)(b) of the Food Standards Code in that the food business failed to take all practicable measures to prevent pests entering the food premises, contrary to Section 22(1) of the Food Act 2008.</p> <p>Charge No. 6 of 9 On 17 November 2025 Failed to comply with a requirement of Standard 3.2.2 Clause 24(1)(c) of the Food Standards Code in that the food business failed to take all practicable measures to eradicate and prevent the harbourage of pests on the food premises, contrary to Section 22(1) of the Food Act 2008.</p> <p>Charge No. 7 of 9 Between 12 November 2025 and 17 November 2025 Failed to comply with a requirement of Standard 3.2.2 Clause 19(1) of the Food Standards Code in that the food premises were not maintained to a standard of cleanliness where there was no accumulation of food waste, dirt and grease, contrary to Section 22(1) of the Food Act 2008.</p> <p>Charge No. 8 of 9 Between 12 November 2025 and 17 November 2025 Failed to comply with a requirement of Standard 3.2.2 Clause 19(2) of the Food Standards Code in that the food business failed to maintain all equipment to a standard of cleanliness where there was no accumulation of food waste, dirt and grease, contrary to Section 22(1) of the Food Act 2008.</p> <p>Charge No. 9 of 9 Between 12 November 2025 and 17 November 2025 Failed to comply with a requirement of Standard 3.2.2 Clause 21(1) of the Food Standards Code in that the food business failed to maintain food premises in a good state of repair, contrary to Section 22(1) of the Food Act 2008.</p> <p>Global fine of \$72,000. Costs of \$2130.00</p>
